

SEXTANT 2010 TANNAT



APPELLATION: Paso Robles, CA

WINEMAKING: Fermented in stainless tanks and aged for 21 months in 10% New French Oak.

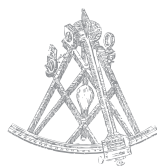
TASTING NOTES: Traditionally grown in Southwest France, the Tannat varietal is beginning to take its place in California and notably in Paso Robles. The 2010 Sextant Tannat is distinct in flavor, both rustic and modern. It beguiles palates accustomed to more common offerings as slightly piquant aromas signal its delicious attributes. There's briary and floral, wild blackberries and tar, firm plums and red currants. Traces of ripe cherries and black bell peppers olives roll in at the edges. The crisp acidity and lively tannins work together towards a lingering, juicy, and racy finish. Tannat has much in store for those who enjoy lusciously distinct wines.
